The Crime Free Multi-Housing Program (CFMH) is a crime prevention program designed to reduce crime, drugs and gangs in rental and business properties. This program was successfully developed at the Mesa Arizona Police Department in 1992. The International Crime Free Programs have spread to nearly 2,000 cities in 44 U.S. States, five Canadian Provinces, Mexico, England, Finland, Japan, Russia, Malaysia, Nigeria, Afghanistan and Puerto Rico.



The Juvenile Intervention Program (JIP) was designed to show troubled teens the reality of incarceration. Juveniles have misconceptions about what life in jail is truly like. They see incidents such as police pursuits, gang violence and drive-by shootings and do not realize the consequences of criminal behavior. This misconception commonly has been delivered by television, or results from the juvenile having friends and family members who have been through the jail system.

JIP has been a successful program with at risk youth and was recently featured on A&E Channel's—Beyond Scared Straight.
